Reducing social inequalities in cancer: evidence and priorities for research

(IARC Scientific Publication No. 168)

There are differences in cancer incidence, survival, and mortality between and within countries. Some of these differences are related to social factors at national (such as Gross national income) or individual level (educational attainment, income level, race/ethnicity, and lifestyle to name a few). More than 70 experts, including several current and former ECS have contributed to an IARC publication which describes these inequalities in cancer and explains their underlying pathways. This book showcases examples of inequalities in every continent and gives real-world solutions to tackle them. Finally, it highlights research priorities (e.g. developing cancer registration and investing in cancer prevention) to eliminate or decrease social inequalities in cancer in the world.

Wrap it up

In this section we feature a wrap-up of published papers by ECS members. In this issue, it is with great pleasure that we are featuring the latest papers of Citadel Cabasag (postdoc, CSU) and Adalberto Miranda (postdoc, CSU) with a brief summary of their main findings.



Citadel Cabasag

The influence of birth cohort and calendar period on global trends in ovarian cancer

This paper provided readers an overview of the international ovarian cancer patterns and trends in 27 countries using latest national estimates of incidence and recorded incidence from successive Volumes of *Cancer Incidence in Five Continents*. It assessed the influence of birth cohort and period of diagnosis to ovarian cancer incidence over time. We showed that ovarian cancer has been declining in Europe and North America, yet increasing incidence was observed in some Asian and Eastern European countries. Moreover, increase in incidence rate ratio was observed among younger cohorts in Belarus and Japan, while strong period effect was observed in Denmark and U.S. around 2000. We postulate on the reasons for the divergent trends in different populations, particularly the use of oral contraceptives and changing registration practice.

Adalberto Miranda

The descriptive epidemiology of lung cancer and tobacco control: a global overview 2018.

This paper is part of a special initiative called "Lung cancer: progress in diagnostic, treatment, prevention and control". In summary, this study has sought to report the most recent global figures on lung cancer and tobacco prevalence data at the global level. In 2018, over two million new lung cancer cases and 1.7 million deaths were estimated to occur worldwide, representing 14% of the new cancer cases and 20% of the cancer deaths. The higher lung cancer incidence rates in parts of South America and Asia are important markers of the current tobacco epidemic. Stable or decreasing incidence rates were predominant among men, while among women increasing rates were common. The continuing rise in lung cancer among women in many countries further reinforces the need for the targeted implementation of smoking cessation policies to curb the tobacco epidemic, as well as the strengthening implementation of lung cancer screening in populations at higher risk.

TIPS AND TRICKS FOR KEEPING YOUR PAPER WITHIN THE PAGE LIMIT

Shrink font size to limits of human perception

If a minimum font sized is imposed, use a font that is 0.2pt smaller. They won't notice, will they?

Take out excessive details of your methodology

Let's face it, nobody really cares (and if they do, why help your competition?)

Border size Rule-of-thumb:

If there is paper exposed, it can be filled (Nature, and other journals, abhors a vacuous submission). If limit exists, apply 0.2pt rule.

Use Max. Abbrev. in Ref. Sec.

Spelling out the journal names will only make it easy for people to look up your competitors' papers.

Rewrite entire paper to make it more concise and easier to understand

Yeah right. Prodigious verbiage establishes your superior intelligence. Also, who has the time?
